



**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING APPROVAL OF EXPENDITURES TO CURRIE MOTORS
FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE (1) 2018 FORD UTILITY POLICE INTERCEPTOR
IN THE AMOUNT OF \$32,345**

WHEREAS, the Village of Vernon Hills, County of Lake, State of Illinois (*"the Village"*) is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, funds are delineated in FY 2018-2019 budget account (2103030-540020) for vehicle purchases; and

WHEREAS, Currie Motors, 10125 W. Laraway Road, Frankfort, IL 60423 is an authorized dealership that has been selected through a competitive bidding process to provide motor vehicles to municipalities participating in the Northwest Municipal Conference Suburban Purchasing Cooperative Contract #152 at the rate specified in the bid (contract); and

WHEREAS, all purchases over \$25,000 require Board of Trustees approval.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF VERNON HILLS, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT: The Village Manager is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Currie Motors to commit the Village to purchase one (1) 2018 Ford Utility Police Interceptor in the amount of \$32,345; and

SECTION 2: AUTHORIZATION AND RELEASE OF PAYMENT: The Finance Director is authorized to process a purchase order and make payment to Currie Motors in the amount of \$32,345; and

SECTION 3: EFFECTIVE DATE: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage, approval and publication as provided by law; and

SECTION 4: ORDINANCE NUMBER: This ordinance shall be known as ORDINANCE NUMBER 2018-122.
