ORDINANCE NO. 2019 -015

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE VILLAGE CODE IN RELATION TO FINES & PENALTIES

WHEREAS, the Village of Vernon Hills, County of Lake, State of Illinois ("the Village") is a duly organized and existing municipality and unit of local government created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the Village is empowered with home rule powers under the 1970 Illinois Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to consolidate and standardize its Fines and Penalties for all violations of the Village Code; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF VERNON HILLS, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: CERTAIN CODE SECTIONS REPEALED: The following Sections of the Village Code are repealed and are replaced in newly created section Chapter 25, Section 25-28 as follows:

- a. Ch. 25 Sec. 25-14 relating to Hotel/Motel Occupancy Tax Violations in Chapter
- b. Ch. 25 Sec 25-16 relating to Planning Miscellaneous Landscaping & Maintenance Violations in Chapter 16.

SECTION 4: MINIMUM FINES Any violation of the Vernon Hills Village Code and/or Zoning Code not provided for specifically in section 3 of this Ordinance shall carry a minimum fine of \$100 per violation for each day or occurrence the ordinance is violated.

SECTION 5: MAXIMUM FINES: Unless otherwise specified, the maximum fine for any violation under the Village Code or the Zoning Code shall be \$1250,; provided however that this maximum amount shall not be applicable to the total fine imposed for the violation of any Ordinance the fine for which is imposed on a daily basis.

SECTION 6: ORDINANCE NUMBER: This Ordinance shall be known as Ordinance Number 2019-015.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from its passage and approval.
